PHYSICIAN (THIRD PARTY) QUESTIONNAIRE

The person named above, who is a resident in federally subsidized housing, has made a request to our company for a Reasonable Accommodation under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act which states that a person with known physical or mental limitations (handicap/disability) is entitled to a reasonable accommodation. In this case, the individual has requested the following:

(The law further states that non-handicapped persons may be excluded from the benefits of a program if the program is limited by Federal statute or executive order to individuals with handicaps.) Definition - handicapped person

The federal government defines a handicapped person as someone who has physical or mental impairment that meets the following conditions:

- (a) Substantially impedes his/her ability to live independently, and is of such a nature that this ability could be improved by more suitable housing conditions;
- (b) Substantially limits one or more major life activities, has a record of such an impairment, or is regarded as having such an impairment;
- (c) One whose condition is expected to be of long-continued and indefinite duration.

Definition - disabled person

A person is considered disabled if: (1) the following Social Security disability definition is met, or (2) the individual has a developmental disability as described in paragraph (b) or physical, mental or emotional impairment as described in paragraph (c).

(a) Section 223 of the Social Security Act defines disability as:

“Inability to engage in any substantial, gainful activity by reason of any medically determinable physical or mental impairment which can be expected to result in death, or which has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous period of not less than 12 months, or,

“In the case of an individual who attained the age of 55 and is blind and unable by reason of such blindness to engage in substantial, gainful activity requiring skills or ability comparable to those of any gainful activity in which he has previously engaged with some regularity and over a substantial period of time.”

(b) Section 102(7) of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act (42 U.S.C. 6001(7) defines developmental disability in functional terms as:

“Severe chronic disability that: (a) is attributable to mental or physical impairment or combination of mental and physical impairments; (b) is manifested before the person attains age 22; (c) is likely to continue indefinitely; (d) results in substantial functional limitation in three or more of the following areas of major life activity: (1) self-care; (2) receptive and responsive language, (3) learning, (4) mobility,

(5) self-direction, (6) capacity for independent living, and (7) economic self-sufficiency; and (8) reflects the person's need for a combination and sequence of special, interdisciplinary, or generic care, treatment or other services which are of lifelong or extended duration and are individually planned and coordinated."

(c) Has a physical, mental or emotional impairment that:

(1) substantially impedes his or her ability to live independently, (2) is of such a nature that ability to live independently could be improved by more suitable housing conditions, and (3) is expected to be of long-continued and indefinite duration.

1. The requested accommodation:
